Sue Morse Scholarship: Infant Mental Health 2020

Sue Morse Scholarship - Notes for entrants

The Scholarship

Clinical Supervision for 8 sessions, or up to the value of \$1,000, over a 12-month period, and a 12-month membership to AAIMH. In consultation with the sub-committee, the successful applicant will be responsible for negotiating with their chosen supervisor. AAIMH Vic Committee will offer suggestions for potential supervisors when requested.

Terms and conditions of entry:

- 1. Applicant must be currently working with infants 0-3yrs
- 2. Applications are to be in English
- 3. Applications should address the selection criteria and include contact details of a proposed referee.
- 4. The scholarship is to be utilized, in consultation with the supervisor, within 12 months of being awarded
- 5. Remote access supervision will be made available to rural and remote winners, or when deemed more appropriate
- 6. The judges' decision will be final. No further correspondence will be entered into.
- 7. AAIMHI Victoria will notify the successful applicant and the scholarship will be announced at the AAIMH Vic August 2020 quarterly seminar, or at an alternative event as agreed by the AAIMH Vic committee.

The closing date will be <u>12/06/2020.</u> Late applications will not be accepted.

The successful recipient of the scholarship will be notified directly by AAIMH Victoria and will be announced at the AAIMH Vic Quarterly Seminar in August 2020.

A subcommittee of AAIMH Victoria Branch will process the Sue Morse Scholarship. All submitted applications which qualify, (see terms and conditions) will be evaluated by a panel of at least three judges. The judging panel will include an AAIMH Vic committee member together with at least one speech pathologist experienced in work with infants.

The decision of the judges will be final. The judges reserve the right to award no scholarship if submitted applications are deemed not of an appropriate standard.
