[Julie A. Larrieu, Ph.D.](#), a developmental and clinical psychologist, is a Professor of Psychiatry and Behavioral Sciences at the Tulane University School of Medicine. She is a senior trainer at the Institute of Infant and Early Childhood Mental Health and the Senior Psychologist at the Tulane Comprehensive Assessment and Treatment Team, with provides intensive intervention with infants, young children and their families who are involved with the child welfare system. She is the site director for the Tulane component of the Early Trauma Treatment Network, a program within the National Child Traumatic Stress Network. This program, funded by the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration, is disseminating Child-Parent Psychotherapy (CPP) for children aged birth to six who have experienced interpersonal violence and sudden loss.

<p>What is CPP?</p>	<p>CPP is an intervention model for children ages 0-5 years who have experienced traumatic events and/or are experiencing mental health, attachment, and/or behavioral problems. Therapeutic sessions include the child and parent or primary caregiver. A central goal is to support and strengthen the caregiver-child relationship as a vehicle for restoring and protecting the child’s mental health. Treatment also focuses on contextual factors that may affect the caregiver-child relationship (e.g., cultural norms and socioeconomic and other stressors).</p> <p>For additional information about CPP, including the five randomized trials conducted on the model, please see the Child-Parent Psychotherapy Research Summary at https://childparentpsychotherapy.com/about/research/</p>

Training Components and Dates	<p>Training will occur through an 18-month CPP Learning Collaborative (LC) that meets the standard for a CPP Implementation Level Course. The learning collaborative model is the dissemination strategy used by the NCTSN to support uptake of best practices across a range of service systems and settings. What sets an LC apart from traditional training is the intensive focus on learning-by-doing. An LC includes in-person trainings or “learning sessions,” intensive consultation, and peer-to-peer learning within and across participating organizations.</p> <p>A CPP Implementation level course involves 18-months of training with three learning sessions and twice monthly telephone or video consultation for 18 months. Dates for the face-to-face learning sessions are given below.</p> <p><u>Training Components</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 3 Learning sessions as per above – combination of Online and Face to Face • Consultation groups with an endorsed CPP trainer: Twice monthly consultation calls will be organized during the first learning session by coordinating group leader and participant schedules. Consultation groups are expected to begin on 13th December 2023 and to continue to 11th June, 2025 • Agency-based CPP reflective supervision. This can take place either individually or in groups, with meetings occurring ideally on a weekly basis. The clinical supervisor is a participant in the CPP LC, or one who has already participated in an implementation-level CPP course and has been rostered as a CPP Clinical Supervisor. • Monthly call with supervisors to be arranged during the LC
Training Requirements	<p>Participants who complete all requirements for this 18-month CPP course will be eligible for the roster of CPP clinicians. Participants’ Time Reuirements	<p>Sites should budget time for the participants to engage in the following activities:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Reading the manuals • Participation in equivalent of 7 days of training, Online and Face to Face • Participation in twice monthly case consultation calls • Presenting on at least two consultation calls (including time to complete a write-up), with supervisors present on the calls • Ideally, participation in weekly reflective supervision; at minimum, participation in reflective supervision on weeks in which there is no consultation call • Completion of clinical measures, fidelity forms, and evaluation of the training • Providing CPP services
