This team provides a specialised infant psychiatry consultation and liaison service to infants and their families at the hospital. Beate has worked across PIMH inpatient and community settings in WA after completing senior registrar training in infant psychiatry in Melbourne. She won the RANZCP Connell Werry Prize for Child and Adolescent Psychiatry Training for her thesis on neurodevelopment. She has interests in supporting vulnerable infants through family approaches particularly in the setting of illness and psychosocial adversity.
