The Crowell Procedure was developed by Judith Crowell to assess how parental models of attachment are reflected in interactions between parents and young children.

The Crowell is a series of set tasks that provide a standardised framework for assessing different aspects of relationships between parents and young children, thus promoting valid comparisons between families for assessment and therapeutic purposes. It has been well researched over decades and is used in many parts of the world

in clinical and forensic settings.

The information can then be used to form treatment goals and/or provide direction for case planning in statutory, community and forensic services.

This comprehensive Crowell Procedure training package has been designed to build knowledge and transform skills into practice over an extended period. Participants will be taught to administer, synthesise, and clinically interpret the interview in the two day workshop. Monthly web-based consultations follow the workshop, to embed learning and build confidence.

Who should attend:

Mental health and therapeutic practitioners working with infants and children and their caregivers in assessments (including for Family and Children's Courts) and therapeutic interventions.

Learning outcomes:

During this training participants will learn

how to administer the Crowell Procedure with parents and children aged between 12 months and 5 years and how to interpret results for assessment and therapeutic purposes.

Participants will be provided with a reading pack, suggested toys and working documents.
