Invitation for expression of interest to attend NEWBORN BEHAVIOURAL OBSERVATIONS (NBO) SYSTEM TRAINING WORKSHOP Presented by Campbell Paul and Susan Nicolson

The NBO is a structured session designed to help the parent to observe, together with the clinician, their infant's behavioural capacities and to identify the kind of support their infant needs for successful growth and development. It is a relationship-based tool designed to foster the parent-infant relationship.

It consists of a set of 18 neurobehavioural observations, which describe the infant's capacities and behavioural adaptation from birth to the third month of life.

NBO training is offered by NBO Australia. The 1.5 day NBO training is available for a range of professionals working with families with newborn and very young infants including midwives, child health nurses, paediatricians, neonatologists, obstetricians, social workers, perinatal psychiatrists, clinical psychologists, infant mental health clinicians and family support workers.
